What is Parkinson's?

One person in every 500 has Parkinson's. That's about 120,000 people in the UK. Most people who get Parkinson's are aged 50 or over, but younger people can get it too.

People with Parkinson's don't have enough of a chemical called dopamine because some nerve cells in their brain have died. Without it people can find that their movements become slower so it takes longer to do things. A lack of coordination can also be a problem.

Parkinson's can cause some people's hands and bodies to shake. This can make everyday activities, such as eating, getting dressed, or using a phone or computer, difficult or frustrating.

Although at times life can be difficult, many people with Parkinson's continue to lead active, fulfilling lives.
